

Rearview Mirror



We arrived at the MSR Houston Racetrack on Hwy. 288 in Angleton at 9 am. Honorary Lifetime Club Member: John Noser

(Editor's Note: Your Corvair Houston Board of Directors elected to extend an Honorary Lifetime Membership to one of the founding members of Corvair Houston: John Noser. This article is a tribute to John)

Corvair Houston members have heard the name "John Noser" for what must seem like forever. Pretty good reason for that: John was a driving force for the creation of Corvair Houston.

After serving in Vietnam as an Ejection Seat Specialist on the F-4 Phantom Jet (our deceased members Travis Jackson and Bob Blissard flew the F-4), John

returned to Houston from California towing a 1936 Ford Coupe with his 1965 Impala.

John settled in a large three car garage apartment across I-45 from the University of Houston while he studied Environmental Design. John's brother allowed his new 1962 Monza Sedan (4spd - a/c) to go on dates with John and his girlfriend (John steered, she shifted) . . . John was hooked.

John had soon traded the Impala for a '65 Convertible (Camaro rally wheels, body colored headlight doors, void of trim (Detroit followed by slowly de-chroming cars), while cousin Bob took on the project of finishing the '36. This left John with room for a studio and a 2 car project space soon filled with Corvairs. First there was a \$50, '65 sedan... frozen alternator bearing... remove rear of alternator ,start engine, turn shaft with emery paper, new bearing, drive home, sell to help finance college...... Fun. Many similar projects followed.


Being creative, and a man of action, John had "Corvair name Houston" but no club as of yet. Seeing other attempts not yet coming to fruition, John called an action group to session including Mike Garcia and Charlie Lee. Out of this came the pieces for the current logo and a plan for a first meeting in December 1974. With a calling list of 75 "Corvair Customers", and a CORSA roster, we soon had 39 members and Corvair Houston license frames on order.

newsletter, we had a viable organization that to this day brings loads of fond memories and life long friends together. (I attended, fearful it would be filled with grease covered hot rodders, it wasn't...). John served twice as president (charter) and twice as editor.

John, being a "Native Houstonian", his first days were at Heights Hospital, then Heights Boulevard before settling with his family on the edge of Garden Oaks, a few doors down from the F-4 Phantom parked at Fisher and Alba streets (Google that!) and around the corner from where Patrick learned to dance at his mom's, Patricia Swayze, Dance Studio.

Until recently, John owned a large 2 1/2 story-1908 house in the Montrose. He also, in the early days, had a 100' long shop full of Corvairs, and a business, Dimensional Design, nearby. He enjoyed

redoing and restoring Corvairs, houses and anything with a nice patina, like a red 1940's Chambers Range or a piece of leaded glass, or sandblasting a classic design in his front door glass (Art-antiquesartifacts) (fossils).

Besides having kept Corvair Houston supplied with lots of cars and parts, John likes to travel. Besides trips to Europe, John has a late powered - $^{\circ}61 - 8$ door (with a/c), dubbed "The Raccoon" by the club. The 8 door was set up for camping and travel with modified Corvair camping gear - which had a back seat by day and a bed by night complete with an, install as needed, 110 volt a/c unit. (Ask John for instructions on how to change drivers while traveling in a high speed "convoy" - Celica bucket seats help). This van took he and his significant other on trips to Detroit, Toronto, Atlanta, Charleston, Savannah, Denver (45 Houston members), Dumas, and many other non-national convention trips. The Greenbriar stayed home for conventions

Minneapolis (39 Corvair Houston attendees) and Birmingham.

John has owned gobs of Corvairs, his favorites include a Maroon '61 Lakewood, the '61 8 door van, most any "late", including 3 a/c Corsas (two convertibles and one coupe) - but no '60s, Loadsides or Spyders. (John contends only no oil leaks or any turbo - only way to ruin Corvair engines)

The collecting and active Corvair participation fed the notion that "Every Corvair in South Texas was once owned by John Noser" (Take that, Greg Riley). John didn't just collect, he also innovated clever ideas in addressing Corvair body and paint modifications, suspension updates, air conditioning, John towed his (now Billy Dove's) '61 rampside back from Denver with the 8door (picking up a "coil on top -refrigerator along the way) stopping at radio station KDDD in Dumas Texas to commemorate the 8-doors early life as a portable radio station.


John Noser has certainly enjoyed his Corvair

Thank you for this remembrance.


