Our Corvair rescue league is an adventurous bunch for sure. They see

It struggles to run at first, but finally submits to the urge to rejoin the ranks of the mechanical. Like a Timex watch, Corvair engines take a licking and keep on ticking.

Harvesting parts and retrieving unwanted Corvairs has become our

favorite pastime. Why clean the yard or repair the house when you can roll up your sleeves, break out the tools, and pick apart a Corvair? Have you ever seen the smile on the face of a grown man when he locates a part that is in better condition than the one on his car? It's a good thing there is no eleventh commandment "Thou shall not covet your neighbor's Corvair." If that were the case, we would all be in trouble.

In the last few years, our club has engaged in a significant number of rescue operations across Texas and Oklahoma. There are more to come. It's all in good fun and, more importantly, we are preserving a piece of Americana and automobile history at its finest, funniest, and most misunderstood. 
